

Now that you have my suggestions for your first year courses, you will want to do two things:

- First, take a look at all of our online tools to help you get a better sense of your degree program and how all the courses fit together – I’m talking about the program worksheet we discussed in the course selection video, but also the actual “undergraduate calendar” which is the official list of all the university rules, programs and course descriptions. You should use this to understand what courses are offered at Concordia, and to see what each course’s prerequisites and co-requisites are.
- The second thing you may want to do is meet with your JMSB academic advisor to discuss anything related to your classes in greater detail. The academic advisors are here to help you even before your first day of school at JMSB. You will see that you’ve been assigned an advisor in your MyConcordia Portal, but you can also click on the advising link beside this video for more information about their appointment types.

In a nutshell – JMSB Academic Advisors host walk-in sessions every weekday at our offices on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor of the Molson Building, where you can get help and advice about your academics; they also have appointments that you can book in advance if you really want to get into detail about topics like switching majors, or planning your courses beyond the first year.
